He has spent the last three years in Sabah to experience hands-on all about coral reef restoration and turtle rehabilitation. He has also gotten off the beaten path and surveyed reefs from Kota Kinabalu to Pulau Banggi, an island off the Tip of Borneo. Scott had his formal education at the University of Oregon, and had spent a year at the university's own marine lab. During his time at the university, he worked and gained invaluable knowledge in local aquarium outlets and in a university laboratory.

As the Resident Marine Biologist, Scott oversees all aquatic operations and activities at Gaya Island Resort and Gaya Island Resort Marine Centre. He also leads conservation initiatives such as turtle rescue, rehabilitation and release, coral planting and rehabilitation, and educational outreach programmes to preserve a healthy ecological environment.

Justin Juhun, Resident Naturalist

Justin Juhun, the resort's Resident Naturalist was born in Tawau, a town located on the south-eastern coast of Sabah, and who is of mixed Kadazan, Indian and Chinese descent. His childhood was spent on the plantations given that he comes from a family of wildlife enthusiasts. They were awarded a license by the Sabah Wildlife Department in 1980 to foster wildlife rescued from within the parameters of the plantations. This was key to igniting his love and interest for wildlife care.

It has always brought him a sense of joy and contentment to witness the healthy growth of the wildlife under his care. He has nurtured more than 50 local wildlife species and amongst them were the Orangutans, Borneo Pygmy Elephants, Borneo Gibbons and Maroon Langgurs. Justin guides guests on nature walks at Gaya Island which are both intriguing and educational. The walks vary in terms of distance and difficulty to satisfy guests' different interests. They will discover a botanic reserve exceptionally rich in endemic plants while he enriches their walk with interesting commentaries.
